The Pinaymootang Health Centre is an accredited health run facility and is seeking applications of Community Mentor through a partnership arrangement with Right to Play (RTP).

RTP's program partners with Indigenous organizations across Canada to deliver community-driven, culturally-relevant play-based programming designed to enhance leadership, self-confidence, and self-efficacy among children and youth. Guided by an Indigenous community development model, PLAY and its partners create safe and inclusive spaces where children and youth can share their ideas, their hopes and their fears, and learn the skills to become positive agents of change.

Position Summary:

Promoting Life-skills in Aboriginal Youth (PLAY) the Community Mentor position will be responsible for the planning and implementation of a program geared toward children and youth. The Community Mentor will report directly to both the Director of Health and an assigned RTP Program Officer (as per grant requirements). This Community Mentor role is a one-year full time term position (with the possibility of extension). The position requires an availability to work non-standard hours and will involve occasional travel (two to three times a year).
