The Case Manager Specialist under the guidance of the Program Manager will be responsible for actively promoting the provision of quality individualized supports and regular access to facilities and services within the community and encourage active family participation.

Key Responsibilities:

- Supervise the team of resource workers and ensure staff are a good fit with their client's needs.
- Ensure that the referrals are made to the appropriate community services and agencies.
- Assist in coordination of intakes and referrals.
